Paul Begley EdD – Professor of Education, Nipissing University (Retired). Formerly, Paul was Professor at Pennsylvania State University and OISE/UT. From 1996 to 2011, he was founding international Executive Director of the UCEA Centre for the Study of Leadership and Ethics in Education (CSLEE)

Melanie Dixon RECE, BASc, BEd - Director of Professional Practice, Ontario College of Early Childhood Educators, Canada's only self-regulatory body for the profession of early childhood education.

Richard Kennelly B.A./B.P.H.E, B.Ed., MEd - Principal, J. Clarke Richardson Collegiate, Durham DSB. In 2012, Richard was winner of the first annual CSLE Paul T. Begley Award for contributions to the field of values and leadership in education

David Langford Tchr Coll. Dip. Dip. Tchg – Principal of Awapuni Primary School, Gisborne, New Zealand. David is an invited member of a "Ministerial Cross-Sector Forum", an advisory group set up by New Zealand's Minister of Education. He is also a Trustee for the Te Unga Mai Trust that is involved with the compilation of indigenous (Maori & Pacifica) narratives for use as a component for a place-based curriculum.

Pauline Leonard PhD - Professor and Chair of the Department of Curriculum, Instruction, and Leadership, College of Education, Louisiana Tech University. She spent sixteen years as a public school teacher in rural and remote regions of Atlantic Canada before transitioning into higher education in Canada and the United States

Anthony Normore PhD –Professor and Department Chair of Educational Leadership at California Lutheran University. Tony is an instructional facilitator of Leadership and Ethics for the Summer Principal's Academy at Teachers College, Columbia University. He is also a member of the Leadership

& Ethics Institute at Golden West College's Police Academy/Criminal Justice Training Center in southern California.
